Learn the basics of Japanese Knot Weaving on Lake Superior basalt rocks from beaches in the Two Harbors and Duluth area. You will weave two Japanese Knot patterns using cane. These patterns can also be used on basket corners and handles. You may bring your own rocks if they have not been polished and are smooth, or use a rock that I will supply.

Tools needed are a small scissors and a small weaving tool.

No other basket as suited for hauling things than the Leather Handled Tote. This large basket's strength is attributed to the riveted leather handles woven through the base. This is the attractive solution to haul books to and from school or the library, or if you want a classy looking tote for your clothes to the gym or a carry-on for your next flight cross the country.

Portal - 28 I/4"  $C \times 2 3/4$ "  $H \times 9$ " diameter

Cost: \$85.00

This shallow heat and fold birch bark bowl is stitched with finely split and prepared spruce root. Then, an overlay of willow bark is added to form the hexagonal weave portal. The rim consists of 3 cedar bark elements buttonhole stitched with waxed cotton cord to nicely conform to the outward angle of the edge.
